Science:

In Science, we will be learning about all of the forces around us and how they affect our lives.



Key knowledge:

- That levers are when a rigid bar resting on a pivot is used to move a heavy or firmly fixed load/object
- That pulleys are wheels with a grooved rim around that changes the direction of a force applied to the cord.
- That force meters are used to measure the forces exerted on an object.
- That friction is the resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another.
- That air resistance is the force that is caused by air with the force acting in the opposite direction to an object moving through the air.
