Longitude	Imaginary lines around the Earth running from the North to the South Pole. They are not parallel.
Continents	Continents are the large solid area of land that covers the
Countries	A country is land that is controlled by a single government.
Equator	The Equator is an imaginary circle around Earth. It divides Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.
Geography	Geography is the study of the shape and features of the Earth's surface, including countries, vegetation, climates and how humans use the world's resources.
