

Year 2 Summer I

Science:

In Science, we will be learning about plants! We will be looking at lots of different types of plants and where they grow. As well as planning and undertaking practical investigations into how plants grow from seeds into mature plants and discussing what they need for survival.

<u>Key knowledge:</u>

To observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants

To find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy

To identify different types of plants and the conditions in which they grow.

Art and Design

In Art and Design, we will be learning about...

How to create observational paintings of flowers using water colours. We will develop our skills of colour mixing, shading and tone and research the artist Georgia O'Keeffe.

<u>History</u>

In History we will learn about...

...the life and influence of Florence Nightingale. We will study her life as a nurse and how she changed the way people took care of the sick and injured. We will look at how hospitals were changed for the better ensuring they were kept clean with essential equipment and care.

In Religious Education, we will continue to learn about...

...the Christian community. Having learned about some of the stories that Jesus told and how these influence the life of Christians, will we begin to learn about why Jesus taught people through stories. Ques: Why did Jesus teach people through stories?

Evaluate key teachings studied from the Bible and explain why they may be important to Christians.

Computing

In Computing, we will be learning about...

Programming. We will look at the importance of instructions and algorithms on digital devices. Learning about how computer programs work and how to debug simple programs.

- Understand what algorithms are, how they are implemented as programs on digital devices, and that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions
- Create and debug simple programs
- Use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs
