Tropic of Cancer	The tropics are two imaginary lines that circle the globe mark the boundaries of the tropics. The line called the Tropic of Cancer marks the northern edge.		
Tropic of Capricorn	The line called the Tropic of Capricorn marks the southern edge.		
climate	The usual or average weather conditions over a long period of time.		
continent	A large landmass made up of many countries		
country	An area that is controlled by its own gov- ernment.		
equator	An imaginary line around the globe at lati- tude 0 degrees north, dividing the earth into northern and southern hemispheres.		
latitude	Imaginary parallel lines which circle the globe from east to west		
longitude	Imaginary lines which run north to south across the globe from pole to pole.		
weather	The specific atmospheric conditions on a given day including temperature and rainfall.		
human geography	Features of an environment that have been shaped by people.		
physical geography	The natural features of a place or environ- ment.		
capital city	A capital is a city where a region's government is located. This is where government ment buildings are and where government leaders work.
